As you know, the American Rescue Plan Act was signed into law on March 11, 2021. Three of the largest provisions in the Act include a third round of "stimulus checks" to millions of Americans, extension of unemployment benefits, and funding for small business & housing programs. These provisions are designed to provide Americans with financial resources aimed at overcoming the economic impacts of COVID-19. However, criminal fraudsters often use these uncertain times to target banks and their customers for their own illegal gains. Most commonly, fraudsters try to trick account holders into:

- Giving out their Online Banking username and password.
- Giving out personally identifiable information, like a date of birth or Social Security number.
- Accepting fraudulent funds with the promise of a return or "finder's fee."
- Believing their stimulus check was received in error and demanding it be mailed back by obtaining a bank cashier's check.

Guadalupe Bank remains committed to protecting the security of your accounts and personally identifiable information. *We will NEVER contact you to request your Online Banking credentials or personally identifiable information.* If you receive a call from anyone claiming to be a Guadalupe Bank employee and you are asked for any such information, please end the conversation immediately and call us directly at (830) 792-1950. If you receive a text message or email, please do not open it, click any links within, or respond.
